Guidelines for Bringing Pets to the Church 04/05/2023

To make the church a welcoming environment to all, the following guidelines are established to protect those who are afraid of animals or are allergic to them. These guidelines apply to <u>only</u> <u>activities that take place on the church property, whether indoor or outdoor</u>. We understand that on certain occasions, families need to bring their pets with them, so exceptions are made to accommodate such needs.

- 1. Pets, regardless of type, size, or breed, should not be allowed to intermingle with participants during indoor or outdoor church events.
- 2. If a pet must be brought to the church, it must stay in a separate area or room away from the areas used for church activities in progress.
- 3. The pet's owner must be responsible for it at all times.
 - a. Its barking should not disturb the activities in the church or neighbors in the nearby buildings.
 - b. Its owner must take extra precautions to clean up any mess it creates inside and outside the church building. This includes removing leftover pet food or drink.
 - c. Its owner must take extra precautions to make sure it's not damaging any church or personal property inside or outside the church.
- 4. When a pet is transiting through a common area of the church (e.g., hallway or lobby), it must be leashed or held by someone, and not allowed to roam freely.
- 5. Exceptions to items 1 and 2 can be made for emotional support animals and guide dogs.
- 6. Exceptions to these guidelines can be made by the event coordinator.
